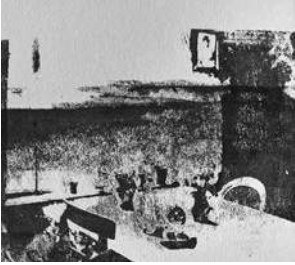

Eddie provides tuition in the timeless craft of basketry through workshops designed to guide participants through each stage of the process. Each participant will take their own handcrafted basket with them at the end of the workshop.

CAVAN COUNTY MUSEUM

Ballyjamesduff, Co. Cavan

The Cavan County Museum exhibition galleries feature unique artefacts dating from the stone age up until the twentieth century; material spanning over 6000 years of occupation in Cavan. Displays of notable interest include the Killycluggin stone and the three-faced Corleck Head, two of the most recognisable examples of Celtic spirituality in the country. The museum also houses a medieval Dug-Out boat and a selection of medieval Sheelana-Gigs, as well as a Folk Life gallery depicting life in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. Newly-opened galleries deal with topics as diverse as the Great Famine, Percy French and the Lords Farnham. As a key artistic venue, its exhibition space plays host to visiting exhibitions, whilst the Eden Gallery is home to regular art shows by local and national artists.

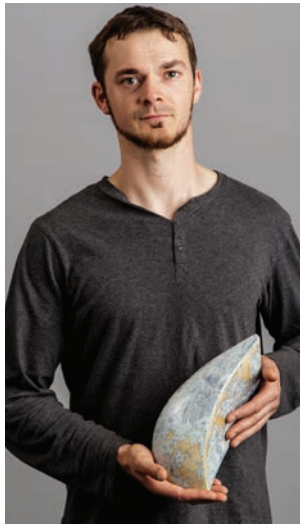
The New Ballagh Centre is housed in an old Church of Ireland chapel which has been transformed into a multi-purpose community resource centre and home to Celtic Flame Candles. A range of locally produced craft products are available for sale in the centre and craft classes are available for visitors. The Celtic Flames Candles range come in a variety of scents inspired by local beauty spots and themes such as Glenaniff Mist, Melvin Sunrise and Leitrim Rose. The chapel was originally opened in 1851 and its beautifully restored stain glass windows were lovingly and carefully created by Sharon and Maureen Byrne. They feature the four seasons and depict Lough Melvin native wildlife including red squirrels, pheasants, otters, herons and kingfishers.

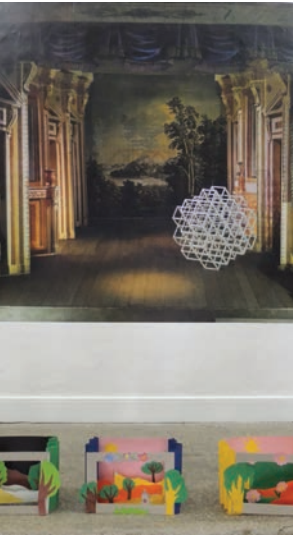

Father and son Kevin and Michael Casey are master craftsmen in the art of bog oak sculpture. Their wood, often centuries old, is taken from local bogs, stored and naturally dried for several years, before it is ready to be worked. This wood is revived and transformed into beautiful abstract or symbolic shapes. The visitor studio and workshop is located in a rural Shannon-side setting just outside Newtowncashel Village near to the pretty limestone Barley Harbour on the banks of Lough Ree. Visitors to the studio can experience the transformation of the bog oak some over 5000 years old into unique works of art.

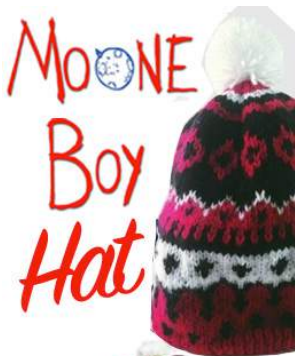
